The Spanish attacker posted solid results throughout the season, with a handful of top-10s in the first half of the season. An aggressive rider who can win sprints out of small breakaways, Florencio came close to victories all season long, with results including 5th at the GP Miguel Indurain and 3rd overall at the Tour du Limousine, and top-30s in stage races such as Catalunya and Suisse revealing his tenacity and consistency. He closed out the season riding in quiet support at the Vuelta a España. For 2010, Florencio will continue to work in the shadows for the team captains and then go on the attack when the opportunity arises to get his own results in breakaways and sprints.
