Biography

The two-time British national champion snagged a well-deserved stage victory during the Tour of Denmark to cap a solid season at Cervélo. At 35, Hunt is one of the most experienced riders on the team, capable of winning sprints on his own or helping team captains stay out of trouble in the grand tours. Hunt made the most of his opportunities at Cervélo and shone in the spring classics, with 3rd at Kuurne-Brussels-Kuurne, 10th at Ghent-Wevelgem and a top-20 at the grueling Paris-Roubaix. Watch for more of the same from ever-steady Hunt in 2010, with an early season peak for the spring classics before reloading for the grand tours.
