Biography

One of the top Canadian prospects in a generation, Rollin is an old-school pedal-basher who can shine in the time trials, solo escapes, the cobblestones and bunch sprints. The native French speaker quickly proved he belonged in the big leagues after crossing the Atlantic following success on the North American circuit to join Cervélo. Rollin posted top-20s at the Monte Paschi and Gent-Wevelgem semi-classics and then a breakout third place at Scheldeprijs-Vlaanderen. Illness wiped out the middle part of his season, but he bounced back to start his first grand tour and closed the season with the fall classics. In 2010, Rollin will continue to develop his classics and sprinting attributes as well as preparing for the World Championships.
